DECEMBER 2023 GUEST ARTIST - Dale Terbush

Dale provided an hour's worth of entertaining banter about his life experiences and artwork. Unfortunately, due to technical difficulties we were unable to record the session. Below is the final painting he was currently working on while showing us his paint studio and previous artwork.



DECEMBER 2023 GUEST ARTIST - Dale Terbush

<u>Dale</u> is a self-taught artist and started painting cartoons as a young child. "Painting pictures is how I breathe". He designed over 350 restaurants for 11 years (NYC to Rodeo Drive) with no architecture training. He relies on his imagination for painting.

He loves glazing and layering. Dale became frustrated with the drying time of oil paints. He was working on 5 paintings at a time. Created his own technique from oils and applied them to acrylic painting. Best secret about Acrylic painting - "They are a thick watercolor!" Dale paints 99% of his paintings flat on a table. He paints on standard size canvases. At one time, he was the number one artist in Japan. He is known for his clouds. "You want your painting to speak to people". Although, not everyone will speak your language. "Don't try to be anyone else and speak what you are trying to do through the canvas". It doesn't matter what tools you use or how you get your results. Just have fun.

Dale began painting at home. He saw a blank wall at the grocery store he worked at and asked to hang four paintings. One day, an interior designer said he should show these paintings to an affluent furniture owner in Orange County, CA. He started buying Dale's paintings. He was able to launch from this name recognition and hit the streets shopping his paintings to anywhere he could get a foot in the door. He studied other painter's techniques for painting silver, brass, gold and started still-life paintings.

Dale's technique: He paints the furthest away sections of the composition first. Then he paints the clouds laying against the horizon. He does <u>not</u> sketch the scene and fill in (paint by number). He weaves back and forth in the painting, sometimes covering areas previously put down. He works from the horizon up so the sky is above your head. He then works down from the horizon to provide a place for the viewer to walk. He sprays his canvas with water (which shows you what it looks like when it is varnished). He will never copy an artist, but will zoom in on an artist's color palette and use them in his own compositions.

Dale painted a 12"x16" 1" thick black foam core landscape scene 45 minutes before our 7pm meeting and it was about 80% complete. He loses himself in his paintings and believes in the power of the subconscious mind. He knows what he does well and what he does not do well. Dale uses Hobby Lobby canvases - best quality for the price. Primary source of acrylics is _______ out of Culver City, CA. He also uses house paints and has the big box stores mix paints for him to match a color he needs. Nova Color has the consistency of warm butter with a huge amount of pigment. He varnishes with *Liquid Tex Solvar* with a sponge brush. He uses *Krud Kutter* to clean his brushes - let them soak overnight. He does not use a palette - he uses craft paper to mix his paints and lets them build up over time.

He will look at a painting from several years ago and say to himself that he is "better than that" now. So, he keeps the good parts and repaints various sections to improve the painting.
